Attitude to School Survey (AtoSS) 2025

About the survey

We value student voice as means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction, and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of your school.

The survey is offered annually by the Department of Education and Training to assist your child's school to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students will be asked about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer and family relation-ships, resilience, bullying, mental health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

This year, the survey will be conducted at your school over the period 19th May to 30th May 2025.

What are the benefits?

In our experience, young people enjoy having their say. DET has been running this survey for nearly 20 years and it has been invaluable in helping schools understand student views. We will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience.




Education Week

Events like the Colour Fun Run and raffles are fundraisers. The students wanted to update the Junior playground. So far we have raised:-


\$5649.74 from the Colour Fun Run.

Spelling Mastery

Starting this term, students in Years 3-6 will also be commencing Spelling Mastery during our Structured Literacy lessons Monday-Wednesday. Spelling Mastery is an evidence-based program that helps students learn spelling in a clear, step-by-step way. It teaches them the rules behind spelling, common patterns in words, and strategies to remember tricky words. Lessons are from 9-9:30, Monday-Wednesday, and students are placed in ability groups. These lessons are short, focused, and designed to build confidence and ac-

Novel Studies


Starting this term, students in Years 3-6 will be commencing novel studies during our Structured Literacy lessons each day. This will allow students to delve deeply in to quality children's

literature and explore the unique themes that exist in these texts. Lessons will include chapter summaries, discussion questions, vocabulary activities, and tasks to build reading, writing, and critical thinking skills. Classroom teachers will use these studies to support students in


developing a stronger understanding of the story, characters, and themes, while also practicing important literacy skills. Novel studies are a fun and structured way for students to engage with books and build confidence as readers and writers. 
