# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## Curriculum Update

### Homework at CSPS

#### Years 3-6

In years 3-6 there is an opt in approach to Homework. This was based on a consultation with school community a few years back. Many parents said their children were already busy with after school activities which included sport, dance, drama, music, scouts, etc. and it was too difficult for their child to do homework at home.

For those families who have their child opt into homework they:-

- **Nightly reading** (20min minimum) – We ask that one of the parents/carers/older siblings note this with a signature in student diaries.
- **Home Learning Matrix**- students choose one activity from one subject area per night. Example: Monday-Writing (One grid)
- **NumBots and Rockstars Timetables**  
Motivational Maths program to help build automaticity of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

We encourage students to practice these at home.

**There will be hard copy activities for those who do not have internet access at home. Home Learning Grid will be posted on Google Classroom for students.**

#### In Yrs 1 - 2

### ***Nightly Reading***

- We encourage our Year 1/2 students to read to (or with) an adult or older sibling for approximately 10 minutes each day.
- Home reading books are selected from the levelled books in the classroom.
- *Reading a wide variety books is important* - Many families like to supplement home readers with sharing and reading books from home.
- Reading can be *to*, with or by the student. It is important to engage in all three at different times regardless of the age or reading level of your child.
- **NumBots**  
Motivational Maths program to help build automaticity of addition and subtraction.

We encourage students to practice these at home.

*If you have any questions about homework for your child or want something extra, please contact your child's teacher directly.*

Any unspent money will be carried over to the following year.


