We would like to advise you of Clifton Springs Primary School's **voluntary financial contributions** (formerly called school fees) for 2025 as listed on the next two pages, including Curriculum and Non-Curriculum Contributions.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.

While our school does receive funding from the Department of Education and Training, there is still a gap each year between what we receive, and what it costs for our teachers to provide a high standard of education and all the amazing opportunities for our children.

The School Council aims to fill this gap through fundraising events each year, but the *most effective way to fill* this gap is through the Voluntary Financial Contributions you make.

Your contributions help our school fund exciting and innovative student learning experiences as well as strengthening our specialist classes (P.E, Music, Art & Science) with the necessary resources, like library books, sports equipment, art supplies, instruments and interactive science activities. It also contributes to the ongoing maintenance of our buildings and grounds.

Your assistance here, is invaluable, and please remember there are ALWAYS payment plan options available for any financial contribution you make, and financial contributions can be made at any time of the year.

Educational Items for students to own (Stationary Packs)

The School Council also believe it is important to ensure families understand the value of the **Educational Items for Students to Own** (Stationary Packs). These are the classroom supplies that are not covered in the funding from the Department of Education & Training, for any Victorian Government school.

Each year our classroom teachers carefully choose what supplies are appropriate for each year level and these are listed as Educational Items to Own. Our School Council has negotiated the best price for quality supplies through WINC, with an easy-to-use online Parent Portal and delivery to your home before the start of the year.

While we can appreciate there are many other different options available to purchase these items, in stores and online, sometimes the products in stores especially the workbooks, are not exactly what the classroom teachers require. Using the WINC online ordering system allows us to make sure we are purchasing the exact items the teachers need for our children, ensuring students have all the required items to maximise their learning throughout the year. It is designed to make it easier for us.

Making Payment for both Voluntary Financial Contributions and Purchasing Stationary Packs through WINC

This year families will have access to paying **voluntary financial contributions** AND purchasing the **stationary pack from** the WINC Parent Portal. The portal offers payment plans via PayPal and Zip Pay.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum contributions for nonitems and activities which the school deems. necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
